What is Title I?

Under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB), the Federal government allocates Title I funds to school districts around the country to provide supplemental resources to assist eligible schools to meet and exceed educational school goals. Schools use their Title I funds in a variety of ways, aimed at improving the performance and closing any achievement gaps which may exist. Indian Prairie's Title I funds are used at the preschool and elementary levels to provide additional instructional support and extended learning opportunities for students, teacher training, and parental involvement opportunities.


